HARVEST 2024





Whilst it seems incredible that almost 12 months have elapsed since Suffolk was hit by Storm Babette as winter approaches it is important that we all make sure any drain/ditches within our premises are cleaned out and ready for what could be ahead. It is much easier to clean out a ditch whilst it is dry or has only a little water in it than wait until it is full/overflowing because of a blockage. If anyone needs help/advice about this please do ask and I will help if I can.

ROADSIDE HEDGES

A gentle reminder to everyone yet to cut their hedges that all roadside hedges should be cut back and maintained to be at least 50cm from the edge of the metalled [tarmac] highway. There are two reasons for this, forward visibility for vehicles and provision of pedestrian refuge. If you haven't already cut your hedges please can you do so soon. Thank you.

SURELY WE ALL BELIEVE THAT ASHFIELD-CUM-THORPE IS A GOOD PLACE TO LIVE? WHY IS THAT?

The Parish Council is the means by which a village like ours protects and improves village life. For Ashfield-cum-Thorpe, it gives us the ability to influence the decisions of Mid Suffolk District Council and Suffolk



County Council and hold them to account. District and County Councillors do listen to us - they attend most Parish Council meetings, and always respond to our requests (if not always exactly the way we want!) The Parish Council can also help steer money to the Parish, influence planning decisions, get Highways issues dealt with and more. Without the Parish Council the village would have no official voice.

The Parish Council should have seven members, but currently we only have four. Can you spare 2 hours, 4 times a year for evening meetings? If yes, then why not become a Councillor!

PLEASE READ BELOW AND CONSIDER WHETHER YOU COULD PLAY A PART.

What is Ashfield Parish Council?

- It's a local authority that works on behalf of the people in the village and has an overall responsibility for the well-being of its local community.
- It comprises up seven (but currently only four) volunteer Councillors drawn from the community, and a paid Clerk who advises on procedure and deals with the paperwork.
- It is funded by all Council Tax payers in the village, who pay a sum called "precept" within their annual or monthly payments.
- It has responsibility as the legal owner of the village hall, lessee for the land on which the village hall is built, and also the telephone box.
- In spite of "Parish" in its name, the Council is not associated with the church.

What does Ashfield Parish Council do?

- Represents the local community, negotiating with and influencing other
 organisations that do make the final decisions (such as the District or County
 Council, highways, planning, health authorities, police etc).
- Encourages and supports various services to meet local needs.
- Works to improve quality of life in the village.

What has Ashfield Parish Council achieved in the past?

Examples include:-

- Limiting the number of HGVs travelling through the village.
- Dealing with sensitive social issues.
- Arranging for "Speed Indicator" signs and traffic surveys.
- Arranging for potholes to be filled in.

ASHFIELD NOTES continued

What's the future of Ashfield Parish Council?

Somewhat bleak. As the number of Councillors falls, so the workload in individuals increases. There is a risk that if the numbers fall further, the Council will cease to exist.

What if Ashfield Parish Council ceased to exist?

Clearly, life in the village would go on. The legal role would be taken over by the District Council..But slowly, inexorably, the village would experience the effects having no community representation. When it comes to 'good' things (such as grants), other villages would get more. When it comes to 'bad' things (such as unwanted planning permissions) there would be nobody to fight our cause.

Of course, the future, good or bad, can't be predicted. But who would want to take the risk?

What help does Ashfield Parish Council need?

Put simply, more Councillors. The Council is authorised to add new Councillors without running an election by a process known as "co-option".

The Council can run efficiently with limited burden on the full seven Councillors. There are normally just four meetings a year, interspersed with a few short ad hoc meetings dealing with planning etc.

CHARSFIELD CHURCHYARD


The churchyard, which is being maintained to encourage wildlife, has had its final cut for this year.

CHARSFIELD PRIMARY SCHOOL

We have been delighted to welcome 5 new pupils to our school this year and they have all settled into life at Charsfield well. All our pupils have started their learning with positive attitudes, and we are looking forward to the term ahead! Here are just a few things that we have been up to since the new school term started a couple of weeks ago:

Pupils in Rowan Class have been writing their own narratives based upon the book "The Smartest Giant in Town" by Julia Donaldson. We have had some wonderful character descriptions from our youngest pupils. In science pupils are using our lovely grounds to learn about plants and animals. In PSHE we are learning about our emotions and how they make us feel and act and what we can do when we feel overwhelmed by our emotions.

Ash Class pupils are improving their descriptive writing using the story "Little Red Reading Hood" – this has included taking part in some role play! In maths lessons pupils are learning about place value so they have a good grounding in number work and, in science lessons, along with Years, 4, 5 and 6, pupils are investigating light.

Our oldest pupils in Oak Class have used the first part of the story "Licked by Paul Jennings" to create their own ending to the story in a piece of drama. From this, the children wrote their own comics using an online programme called Book Creator – we had some very funny sketches! Following on from this, we are now writing our own endings to "Licked". In history we are learning about ancient civilisations. Most recently pupils learned about the discovery of Tutankhamun's tomb by Howard Carter in 1922.

We have started swimming lessons at Framlingham College this term. All pupils across the school swim every year and we really notice the difference in confidence when we take the pupils swimming. After Christmas, the pupils will restart their Forest School sessions.

Last year we held several reading cafes where parents and family members come into school to share books and stories with their child – we are looking forward to holding our first one at the end of the half term in October.

*FREE*Parent and Toddler Group: This takes place every Wednesday afternoon 1.30pm -3pm during term time. Lots of fun activities in a welcoming and nurturing environment. All ages welcome. No need to book – just turn up!



Food Donations across the Benefice

The benefice churches are delighted to be supporting FIND (Families in Need) a local charity based in Ipswich supporting people across the local villages and towns.

For over 30 years, Families in Need (FIND) Ipswich, has offered a lifeline to people in Ipswich and the surrounding areas who are experiencing poverty and despair.

FIND provides free food parcels and personal care items to help people get through a crisis, as well as furniture, bedding and other household items where the person or family has none.

An army of over 80 volunteers regularly give their time freely to check and sort the donated food, collect items from local stores, make up the food parcels and deliver them.

It's a six-day a week operation.

The demand for food parcels has risen year on year and FIND now distributes an average of 120-150 parcels every week and even more at Christmas - more than 7,000 every year.

Going Forward

Each church within the benefice has now become a donation point where there are boxes in the church porches in which donations can be left. The donations will then be collected on a regular basis and taken to the offices of FIND. Currently, the food requirements are as follows:

Long grain rice - Long-life whole milk
Toiletries for men, women and children
Tinned vegetables, meat, fruit/desserts
Coffee - Sugar - Jam - Soup
Pet food (dog, cat, fish, rabbit/guinea pig)




